Monday Transfer Sessions

Transfer sessions (virtually via teletherapy or in person) are generally held on Monday nights (see exception below) starting at 6:35 p.m. for children/teens and 7 p.m. for adults.

Sessions are held on the following dates:

- Monday, June 1 - Monday, July 20
- Monday, June 15 - Monday, August 3

The Weekend Workshop for Effective Communication will be held at The College of Saint Rose on March 27 - 29, 2020.

Therapy will be provided by graduate student clinicians in the Communication Sciences and Disorders program under the direct supervision of certified speech-language pathologists. The Workshop is open to children ages 7 through adults who stutter and their families. All participants attending the in-person workshop also commit to the 6 follow-up sessions in order to manifest progress (see below for more details.)

Participants of our workshop will receive the benefits of individual and group therapy, synergistically addressing all aspects of stuttering (speech, attitudes/feelings, and environment.) Participants will be able to meet other individuals who stutter during structured group therapy and other interactive gatherings. Family activities such as parent meetings and educational sessions for family members will also be scheduled throughout the weekend.



This year we are emphasizing the art of poetry, and with the help of our invited keynote speaker, Adam Giannelli, we will explore ways in which creative writing can help us cope and support progress in therapy.

Mr. Giannelli will join us throughout the weekend by signing books, providing

opportunities for interaction, and delivering a keynote address during our gala dinner on Saturday, March 28, 2020.

Follow-Up Transfer Sessions

In an effort to support the process of creating lasting change, the format of the workshop includes 6 follow-up sessions.

The focus of these sessions is to support you in generalizing the progress achieved throughout the intensive treatment on March 27-29. These follow-up sessions occur on the outlined dates and times in the spring/summer of 2020.

These sessions can be attended in person at The College of Saint Rose or via teletherapy. This is a flexible format using a video-conferencing system with your student clinician.
