

Title IX Offenses & Other Prohibited Misconduct



- Sexual Harassment
- Sexual Assault/Rape
- Domestic Violence
- Dating Violence
- Stalking
- Gender-Based Harassment

What To Do:

1. If someone tells you they have experienced abuse or violence, first respond with empathy and listen to them, offer them support and encourage them to seek help and counseling as soon as possible.
2. If the individual's safety is an immediate concern, call 911 or contact Saint Rose Security.
3. Tear this card at the perforation. Keep this half for your information, and provide the other half to the individual who experienced the violence.
4. Report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator listed on the back of this card in accordance with Campus policies and procedures.
5. If you have any questions about this process, email the Title IX Coordinator at titleix@strose.edu
6. For confidential reporting, you may report to Counseling Center, Health Services or Spiritual Life.

* New York State Law requires that all College employees except those listed above serve as responsible employees and are mandated reporters.

What To Know:

- **This was not your fault.** You are not alone.
- **You have the right** to choose whom you will talk to, what resources you will use, what you will say, and when you will say it.
- **If you choose** to share your experience, your disclosure will be taken seriously and you will be treated with dignity.
- **The College does not tolerate** abuse or violence, including sexual harassment, sexual assault, intimate partner violence, or stalking.
- **You will be protected from** retaliation. The College does not tolerate acts of retaliation against anyone participating in an investigation. If you have experienced harassment, abuse or violence:

Options:

- You have many **resources** available to you at **Saint Rose** and in the community, including options for **support, advocacy, counseling, and medical care** (see reverse).
- You have the right to report to the **police or local law enforcement** to initiate a criminal process.

Why You Need to Report

- To ensure the individual has access to all available resources
- To enhance campus safety
- To comply with Title IX and other federal and state laws and regulations If someone tells you they have experienced harassment, abuse or violence:

Tell The Individual

Read the following paragraph to a person reporting to you:

“You have the right to make a report to Saint Rose Security, local law enforcement, and/or State Police, or choose not to report; to report the incident to the College; to be protected by the College from retaliation for reporting an incident; and to receive assistance and resources from the College of Saint Rose.”

Prohibiton on Retaliation

The College prohibits retaliation of any kind. The College does not tolerate acts of retaliation against anyone for filing a complaint or participating in an investigation. Every effort will be made to protect your privacy.
