

Articulation Agreement
Hudson Valley Community College
(Associate of Art in Psychology)
And
The College of Saint Rose
(Bachelor of Art in
Psychology)

I. Purpose

This agreement between Hudson Valley Community College and The College of Saint Rose provides the terms and conditions for students of Hudson Valley Community College who have an Associate of Art degree in Psychology and seek admission by transfer to The College of Saint Rose. Both parties will use their best efforts to minimize loss of credits and duplication of coursework.

II. Admission

Transfer students from Hudson Valley Community College who have completed an Associate of Art degree and who have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 are generally accepted. The College of Saint Rose reserves the right to evaluate transfer student applicants who do not meet the 2.5 grade point average criteria on an individual basis. Students transferring a minimum of 60 credits receive junior status.

III. Transfer of Credit

In evaluating the credentials of transfer candidates, The College of Saint Rose will make every effort to allow maximum credit for college work completed at Hudson Valley Community College. Credit is given for all applicable courses in which a student achieves a grade of C- or above. Credits transfer, but grades do not. A minimum of 120 credits are required for a Bachelor's degree. A maximum of 70 credits from Hudson Valley Community College may transfer to The College of Saint Rose. Additional credits may transfer upon review.

IV. Scholarships

The College of Saint Rose is committed to enrolling students with superior ability and proven achievement. To support our commitment, we award guaranteed academic transfer scholarships for up to four consecutive years to students who have achieved impressive grade point averages for all previous college work.

V. Terms of Agreement

This agreement becomes effective on the date of signature by the representatives of the institutions contained within the agreement. The terms of this agreement may be modified or terminated at any time upon mutual consent of both institutions with appropriate notification. In the event that it is decided to modify this agreement, commitments made to individual students already in the program will continue in effect in the terms applicable at the time the student enrolled in the program.

Degree Requirements

I. The College of Saint Rose:

Degree: Bachelor of Art in Psychology

Traditional of fully online program

Credits Required: 34

From the 2021-2023 Saint Rose Catalog:

The bachelor of arts (BA) degree in psychology at The College of Saint Rose offers students the opportunity to develop a basic level of knowledge of the discipline of psychology by taking courses in empirical, social-developmental, and applied-clinical areas, with additional elective courses of particular interest to their career goals. The BA degree may be easily combined to form double majors with other disciplines and is ideally suited to accommodate students with diverse educational interests that might be achieved through combining the major with minors and certificates offered by other departments.

The BA degree provides students with excellent preparation for post-graduation employment in a wide variety of fields including human resources, sales, pre-school education, office management, case management, financial consulting, state police, respite provider, and many others. Students with interests in pursuing a master's or doctoral degree in any field of psychology or related field following graduation should complete the bachelor of science degree to receive the support of the Psychology Faculty. The BA degree is not designed to prepare students for graduate work in psychology.

The BA degree is appropriate for:

- a. Students who wish to directly enter the workforce following graduation
- b. Graduate degrees in School Guidance Counseling
- c. Graduate degrees in Education (e.g., Primary or Secondary Education, Leadership & Administration, etc.)
- d. Masters of Business Administration or other master's or doctoral degree in Business (excluding Industrial & Organizational Psychology)
- e. Graduate degrees in disciplines associated with traditional programs in the Arts & Humanities (Students interested in a graduate degree in a Recreational Therapy, such as Art Therapy, are strongly encouraged to complete the BS degree in Psychology.)

Students interested in pursuing a graduate degree in the following areas should complete the BS in Psychology:

- f. Any Psychology degree at the master's or doctoral level (for example: I/O Psychology, School Psychology, Forensic Psychology, Educational Psychology, Counseling Psychology, Clinical Psychology, Social Psychology, etc.)
- g. Any Neuroscience degree at the master's or doctoral level
- h. Mental Health Counseling
- i. Social Work/Clinical Social Work
- j. Applied Behavior Analysis
- k. Medical School (unless the BA degree in Psychology is completed as part of a double major with a BS in one of the natural sciences)

III. Notes for Hudson Valley Community College/The College of Saint Rose Bachelor of Art in Psychology agreement:

- a. Students will complete at least 62 credits at HVCC and up to 70 credits can transfer to Saint Rose. This plan is based on the successful transfer of 62 credits from Hudson Valley Community College to The College of Saint Rose and seamless transfer of The College of Saint Rose Core Requirements. All possible electives are listed in this agreement and the student, along with his/her advisor, should select the most appropriate courses to complete his/her degree while not unnecessarily exceeding the number of credits required for the Bachelor of Science degree. A minimum of 30 credits must be taken at Saint Rose.

- b. A letter grade of C- or higher in each course is required for transfer into The College of Saint Rose. Any completed coursework with a grade lower than C- will not be transferred.
 - a. This document is valid until the time which either party changes their respective program. At which point review/revision will be required.
 - b. The Transfer Equivalency Database is the most current tool to utilized when determining the transferability of credits into The College of Saint Rose. The Transfer Equivalency Database can be accessed by visiting the link below:



Saint Rose Core Requirements & Seamless Transfer

I. Saint Rose CORE (33 credits):

1. Expository Writing, Communication & Research Techniques
2. Literary Studies
3. Study of World Languages and Cultures
4. Philosophical and Religious Traditions
5. Scientific Knowledge and Inquiry
6. Mathematical Reasoning
7. Computational Logic and Reasoning
8. Social Scientific Knowledge and Inquiry
9. Historical Knowledge, Analysis, and Perspective

II. Diversity Requirement: We require that all students pursuing bachelor's degrees at Saint Rose take three credits that fulfill our diversity requirement.

III. Seamless Transfer Policy

Students who have completed an Associate's Degree in Science (A.S.), an Associate's Degree in Art (A.A.), or bachelor's degree from a SUNY institution will transfer to Saint Rose with all liberal education requirements satisfied.

Students with an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) or Associate in Applied Business (A.A.B.) may be eligible to receive the same benefits after a course-to-course evaluation is completed at Saint Rose. When sending the Hudson Valley transcript also request the GETA report to be sent to The College of Saint Rose.

*If the student has taken both PSYC 275 and PSYC 280, then PSYC 280 will transfer in as PSY 295, with the specific requirement that the student contact their PSY 299 professor 2-3 weeks prior to the start of the course at The College of Saint Rose to establish the required research project topic necessary to begin PSY 299 (this is normally established in our PSY 295 course). If the student has not taken both PSYC 275 and PSYC 280, then they will be required to take both PSY 295 and PSY 299 at The College of Saint Rose.

**FORM 102 (1) is required for degree completion at HVCC, but this course is taken Pass/Fail, and does not transfer to The College of Saint Rose
