



Program Articulation Agreement
Between
SUNY Fulton Montgomery
(General Studies AA)
And
The College of Saint Rose
(Early Childhood and Childhood Education Birth-6 BS)

I. Purpose

This agreement between SUNY Fulton- Montgomery and The College of Saint Rose provides the terms and conditions for students of Fulton Montgomery Community College who have an Associate of Arts Degree in General Studies and seek admission by transfer to The College of Saint Rose. Both parties will use their best efforts to minimize loss of credits and duplication of coursework.

II. Admission

Transfer students from SUNY Fulton -Montgomery Community College who have completed an Associate of Arts degree in General Studies and who have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 are generally accepted. The College of Saint Rose reserves the right to evaluate transfer student applicants who do not meet the 2.5 grade point average criteria on an individual basis. Students transferring a minimum of 60 credits receive junior status.

III. Transfer of Credit

In evaluating the credentials of transfer candidates, The College of Saint Rose will make every effort to allow maximum credit for college work completed at SUNY Fulton-Montgomery. Credit is given for all applicable courses in which a student achieves a grade of C- or above. Credits transfer, but grades do not. A minimum of 120 credits are required for a Bachelor's degree. A maximum of 70 credits from Fulton Montgomery Community College may transfer to The College of Saint Rose. Additional credits may transfer upon review.

IV. Scholarships

The College of Saint Rose is committed to enrolling students with superior ability and proven achievement. To support our commitment, we award guaranteed academic transfer scholarships for two years to students who have achieved impressive grade point averages for all previous college work.

V. Terms of Agreement

This agreement becomes effective on the date of signature by the representatives of the institutions contained within the agreement. The terms of this agreement may be modified or terminated at any time upon mutual consent of both institutions with appropriate notification. In the event that it is decided to modify this agreement, commitments made to individual students already in the program will continue in effect in the terms applicable at the time the student enrolled in the program.

III. Notes for Fulton Montgomery Community College /The College of Saint Rose Early Childhood and Childhood Education (Birth-6) agreement:

- a. Students will complete at least 62 credits at Fulton Montgomery Community College and up to 70 credits can transfer to Saint Rose. This plan is based on the successful transfer of 62 credits from Fulton Montgomery Community College to The College of Saint Rose and seamless transfer of The College of Saint Rose Core Requirements. All possible electives are listed in this agreement and the student, along with his/her advisor, should select the most appropriate courses to complete his/her degree while not unnecessarily exceeding the number of credits required for the Bachelor of Science degree. A minimum of 32 credits must be taken at The College of Saint Rose.
- b. A letter grade of C- or higher in each course is required for transfer into The College of Saint Rose. Any completed coursework with a grade lower than C- will not be transferred.
- c. This document is valid until the time which either party changes their respective program. At which point review/revision will be required.

- d. The Transfer Equivalency Database is the most current tool to utilized when determining the transferability of credits into The College of Saint Rose. The Transfer Equivalency Database can be accessed by visiting the link below:



Appendix 1

Saint Rose Liberal Core Requirements & Seamless Transfer

I. Saint Rose CORE (33 credits):

1. Expository Writing, Communication & Research Techniques
2. Literary Studies
3. Study of World Languages and Cultures
4. Philosophical and Religious Traditions
5. Scientific Knowledge and Inquiry
6. Mathematical Reasoning
7. Computational Logic and Reasoning
8. Social Scientific Knowledge and Inquiry
9. Historical Knowledge, Analysis, and Perspective

II. Diversity Requirement: We require that all students pursuing bachelor's degrees at Saint Rose take three credits that fulfill our diversity requirement, (3-4 credits).

III. Seamless Transfer Policy

Students who have completed an Associate's Degree in Science (A.S.), an Associate's Degree in Art (A.A.), or bachelor's degree from a SUNY institution will transfer to Saint Rose with all liberal education requirements satisfied.

Students with an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) or Associate in Applied Business (A.A.B.) may be eligible to receive the same benefits after a course-to-course evaluation is completed at Saint Rose. Please request the GETA report to be sent to The College of Saint Rose along with your official college transcript.
